		Only pre-final and final year UG students with a CGPA of 8.0 or above are eligible. The student should hold only one TA ship per semester The student should not be involved in any indiscipline and unfair means cases.

		Assisting the Course coordinator in tutorial or laboratory classes. Providing guidance to students during problem-solving sessions and practical exercises.
		Assisting the faculty in the creation of learning content, preferably in the form of: Animations (e.g., visual explanations of concepts), Interactive codes and simulations

		Engagement Hours: TAs may be engaged for up to 4 hours per week during the semester.
		Honorarium and Certification: A certificate of Teaching Assistantship will be issued upon successful completion of duties. A modest financial assistance will be offered, the amount of which will be determined by the competent authority depending on institutional policies. Selection Process: Interested students must apply via a standard application form. Selection will be based on academic performance & performance in the specific course in which student wish to apply for TA ship, and recommendation from DUGC and supervising faculty.
