The agenda items were discussed one by one, and resolutions for each agenda items are as follows:

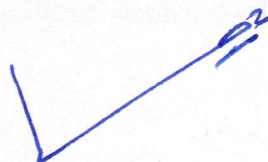
<i>Item No. 63-1.0</i>	:	To confirm the minutes of 62 nd meeting of the Senate. The minutes of the 62 nd Meeting of the Senate, held on 08 April 2026, had been circulated to all members for their comments. No comments were received. The Senate confirmed the minutes of the 62 nd Meeting of the Senate held on 08 April 2026.
<i>Item No. 63-2.0</i>	:	To note the "Action Taken" on the decisions taken in the 62 nd meeting of the Senate. The Senate noted and accepted the Action Taken Report on the decisions taken in the 62 nd Meeting of the Senate.
<i>Item No. 63-3.0</i>	:	Item for consideration
<i>Item No. 63-3.1</i>	:	To consider the request of the former Ph.D. student, Mr. Vikas Sangwan (ID: 2018RME9100), for the grant of mercy for the revival of his terminated Ph.D. registration. The Senate approved the request and permitted Mr. Vikas Sangwan (ID: 2018RME9100) to seek fresh registration in the Ph.D. programme. He is permitted to register afresh and complete the coursework requirements again. His eligibility for promotion to the subsequent semester shall be evaluated based on his academic performance after re-registration under the supervision of proposed supervisors.
<i>Item No. 63-3.2</i>	:	To consider the mercy requests of M.Sc. first-semester students Ms. Madhu Saini (2025PPH5259) (CGPA: 3.8) and Ms. Neelam Lora (2025PPH5294) (CGPA: 2.0) against termination due to a CGPA below 5.5 in AY 2025-26. The Senate approved the mercy request of Ms. Madhu Saini (2025PPH5259) and Ms. Neelam Lora (2025PPH5294). Both are permitted to re-register in the programme and repeat all the first-semester courses. Their eligibility for promotion to the subsequent semester shall be evaluated based on their academic performance after re-registration.

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		continuation in the M.Tech. (Power Electronics and Drives) programme. The Senate approved the mercy request of Ms. Ritu Ankodiya (ID: 2025PPD5360). She is permitted to re-register in the programme and repeat all the first-semester courses. Her eligibility for promotion to the subsequent semester shall be evaluated based on her academic performance after re-registration.

After due deliberation, the Senate approved the request of Ms. Ruchika Arora (ID: 2026RHS9091) to carry forward the Ph.D. coursework credits earned under her previous registration (ID: 2025RHS9055).															
Item No. 63-3.8	:	To consider the matter of Mr. Rahul (2018UCH1663) regarding termination after completing the maximum permissible duration. The Senate approved the termination of enrolment of Mr. Rahul (2018UCH1663) after completing the maximum permissible duration.															
Item No. 63-3.9	:	To consider the request of Mr. Ambuj Singh (ID: 2019UME1291) regarding Semester withdrawal from previous semesters and registration in the upcoming semester. The Senate approved the mercy request of Mr. Ambuj Singh (St ID: 2019UME1291) for withdrawal from the previous 12th, 13th and 14th Semesters and for registration in the upcoming Odd Semester of AY 2026-27.															

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Item No. 63-3.10	: To consider the matter of Mr. Harsh Meena (2022UMT1882) regarding promotion to the 2nd year B.Tech. The Senate did not approve the request of Mr. Harsh Meena (ID: 2022UMT1882) for promotion to the second year of the B.Tech. programme and resolved to terminate his admission to the Institute.
Item No. 63-3.11	: To consider the revised curriculum and syllabus of the Program M.Tech. in Structural Engineering. The Senate approved the proposed revision in the curriculum and syllabus of the Program M.Tech. in Structural Engineering.
Item No. 63-3.12	: To consider the revised curriculum and syllabus of the M.Tech. Program in Earthquake Engineering. The Senate approved the proposed revision in the curriculum and syllabus of the Program M.Tech. in Earthquake Engineering.
Item No. 63-3.13	: To consider the proposal submitted by the Department of Electrical Engineering regarding the interconversion of vacant seats between the Full-Time (Sponsored) and Part-Time (Sponsored) categories for admission to the M.Tech. (Power Systems) and M.Tech. (Power Systems Management) programmes for the Academic Session 2026–27. After detailed deliberations, the Senate approved the proposal for interconversion of vacant seats between the Full-Time (Sponsored) and Part-Time (Sponsored) categories within the same programme, subject to the availability of eligible candidates, fulfilment of the prescribed admission criteria, and the condition that no eligible candidate for vacant seat is available in particular category (Full-time/Part-time sponsored) and the overall sanctioned intake of the respective programme shall remain unchanged. The Senate further resolved that the above mechanism may be adopted uniformly by all Departments/Centres of the Institute for all postgraduate programmes having separate Full-Time (Sponsored) and Part-Time (Sponsored) categories, subject to the applicable admission rules and the approved sanctioned intake.
Item No. 63-3.14	: To consider the approval for preparation and issuance of an original Degree Certificate in respect of ex-student Mr. Chiranjeev Singh (2017UEC1772). Considering the facts that the original Degree Certificate is presently untraceable in the Academic Section. The Senate resolved that another Degree Certificate may be prepared and issued to ex-student Mr. Chiranjeev Singh (2017UEC1772). Further, if the original Degree Certificate is traced at any stage in the future, it shall be cancelled and destroyed in the presence of the Dean (Academic) and the Registrar.
Item No. 63-3.15	: To consider the recommendations of the UG Curriculum Review Committee for approval by the Senate.

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	After detailed deliberations, the Senate approved the recommendations of the UG Curriculum Review Committee and further resolved as follows: 1. The range of open elective credits shall be from 3 to 9. 2. Accordingly, Departments may suitably adjust the Programme Core credits, provided that the overall programme credit requirement remains within the prescribed range of 160 to 166 credits. 3. In case of multi entry/ multi exit options for a program, the surrendered certificate will be returned to the student.
Item No. 63-3.16	: To consider the New UG Schemes and New/revised Syllabi for UG programmes. After detailed deliberation, the Senate approved the New UG Schemes and New/revised Syllabi for UG first year program to be implemented from the Academic Session 2026-27, with the following changes: 1. Department of Mathematics • to include the relevant engineering applications of the topics being taught in the institute core courses Mathematics-I and Mathematics-II. • to propose Department specific mathematics courses as PLEAS category in 2nd Year, on request of concerned department. 2. Department of Physics • to merge the Classical Physics Lab and Modern Physics Lab into Engineering Physics Lab • to name the units in Modern Physics appropriately in accordance with the topics covered. 3. Department of Civil Engineering • to rename the title of the 'Engineering Drawing and Sketching lab' as 'Engineering Drawing lab' 4. Academic Section • to formulate the evaluation scheme for 1 credit theory courses. 5. All Departments (except Physics & Mathematics Department) • to conduct Curriculum Development workshop and submit curriculum & syllabi of 3rd to 8th semester along with recommendations by 15th November 2026. The Senate further resolved that the changes suggested by the Senate shall be incorporated by the concerned Departments and authorized the Chairman, Senate, to approve the revised curriculum incorporating such changes.
Item No. 63-3.17	: To consider the recommendations regarding the one-credit Industry Connect (AUDIT) Course. The Senate approved the proposal for introducing the one-credit Industry Connect

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		Course initially as an Audit Course. The Senate further resolved that the outcomes of the course shall be reviewed after its implementation to assess its effectiveness and to determine whether it should continue as an Audit Course or be converted into a credit-bearing course.
<i>Item No. 63-3.18</i>	:	To consider the recommendations for introducing Institutional Minor Programmes. The Senate deliberated in detail on the recommendations of the Senate Undergraduate Board (SUGB) regarding the introduction of Institutional Minor Programmes and approved it in principle. The Senate further stated that modalities and mechanism may be framed by the Academic Section before its implementation.
<i>Item No. 63-3.19</i>	:	To consider the names of student representatives in the Senate. The Senate deliberated on the proposal and resolved that student representation in the Senate should comprise one representative each from the Undergraduate, Postgraduate, and Ph.D. programmes. It was further resolved that the Undergraduate representative shall ordinarily be selected from the third year of the programme, the Postgraduate representative from the second year, and the Ph.D. representative from among the registered Ph.D. scholars having completed comprehensive examination. The Senate also resolved that the composition of the student representatives should include at least one female student.

Item No. 63-6.1	: To consider the mercy application of Mr. Nimit Gupta (2022PCS5312), M.Tech. (Structural Engineering), Department of Civil Engineering, for permission to rejoin the M.Tech. programme in Part-Time mode. The Senate approved the mercy request of Mr. Nimit Gupta (Scholar ID: 2022PCS5312) and permitted him to rejoin the M.Tech. Item No. 63-6.2	: To consider the Credit Based Fee Policy for registration of backlog courses by Undergraduate Students Exceeding the Minimum Prescribed Duration of Degree Programmes.																				

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The Senate approved the following guidelines for the implementation of the credit-based fee applicable to Undergraduate students exceeding the minimum prescribed duration of their respective degree programmes, in accordance with the resolution of the Board of Governors (BoG):

Existing Applicable Fee

For undergraduate students registering in the IX semester (XI semester in case of B.Arch.) and beyond, i.e., after completion of the regular VIII semester (X semester for B.Arch.), the same fee structure as applicable during the regular semesters is presently charged. No concession in tuition fee is provided for such extended-semester registrations, irrespective of the number of credits registered by the student.

Proposed Fee

It is proposed that, with effect from the Academic Session 2026–27, the following fee structure be adopted for undergraduate students registering in extended semesters: The undergraduate students registering in the IX semester (XI semester in case of B.Arch.) and beyond, shall be charged tuition fee on a credit basis, while the Institute Fee and other common fees shall continue to be charged as per the applicable fee structure.

Semester	Institute Fee	Proposed Tuition Fee for Backlog Courses
IX semester (XI semester of B.Arch.) and beyond	As per the applicable Institute Fee structure	₹4,000 × Number of registered credits

To maintain parity with the regular semester fee structure, it is proposed that:

- For students registering for up to 15 credits, the tuition fee shall be calculated on a credit basis at the rate of ₹4,000 per credit.
- For students registering for more than 15 credits, the tuition fee payable shall be the same as the tuition fee applicable during a regular semester, with no concession.

For undergraduate students admitted through JoSAA/CSAB centralized counselling under the General, OBC, and EWS categories, with annual family income above ₹5 lakh, the tuition fee shall be charged as per the credit-based structure proposed above.

For undergraduate students admitted through JoSAA/CSAB centralized counselling under the General, OBC, and EWS categories, with annual family income between ₹1 lakh and ₹5 lakh, availing the benefits of Fee Remission, it is proposed that:

- For registration of up to 5 credits, tuition fee shall be calculated on a credit basis at the rate prescribed above.
- For registration of more than 5 credits, the tuition fee payable shall be the same as that applicable during a regular semester, with no concession.

Any student registering for any graded course for first time even beyond minimum prescribed program duration, the provisions under this policy are not applicable.

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	The proposed tuition fee structure shall not apply to undergraduate students admitted through JoSAA/CSAB under the following categories, as they are already exempted from payment of tuition fee under the existing rules: • Scheduled Caste (SC) • Scheduled Tribe (ST) • Persons with Disabilities (PwD) • Students belonging to the family income category of up to ₹1 lakh per annum, availing the benefits of Fee Remission The proposed tuition fee structure shall also not apply to undergraduate students admitted under special admission categories such as: • DASA • ICCR • MEA • Study in India • Any other similar admission category The proposed fee structure is intended to align the tuition fee liability of students in extended semesters with their actual academic registration load, while ensuring recovery of institutional and common service charges as per existing norms. As per the Gazette Notification Statutes dated 23 April 2009, Statute No. 37 (Fees), Sub-clause (i) provides that the tuition fee shall be determined by the NIT Council and shall be uniform across all National Institutes of Technology (NITs), which is presently Rs.62500/- per semester. Further, if any changes made by NIT Council w.r.t. Tuition Fee then this proposed policy i.e. Rs.4000/- per credit for backlog courses, shall proportionality may be changed in future.
Item No. 63-6.3	: To consider the mercy application of Mr. Utkarsh Yadav (2024PCP5307), M.Tech. (Computer Science and Engineering), Department of Computer Science and Engineering, for continuation of M. Tech. programme and conversion from Full Time to Part-Time. The Senate approved the mercy application of Mr. Utkarsh Yadav (ID: 2024PCP5307) and permitted him to continue the M.Tech. (Computer Science and Engineering) programme by converting his registration from Full-Time to Part-Time mode.
Item No. 63-6.4	: To consider the MoU between MNIT Jaipur & IIT Jodhpur. The salient features of the proposed MoU between MNIT Jaipur & IIT Jodhpur regarding joint B.Tech.-M.Tech. program were presented. After due deliberation the Senate approved the proposal in principle and authorized the Chairman Senate to sign the MoU.
Item No. 63-6.5	: To consider the proposal for establishment of “Centre for Intelligent and Sustainable Power Management (CISPM)” at MNIT Jaipur. The Senate deferred the agenda item and directed that it be placed before the next meeting of the Senate.
